About the Society

The Simon Fraser Student Society (SFSS) is a non-profit organization that represents every undergraduate student at SFU. All undergraduate students are automatically members of the society and pay an activity fee (appendix 1). The SFSS is mandated to coordinate and promote all activities for undergraduate students. In pursing its mandate, the SFSS offers a variety of services such as the Women's Centre, Out On Campus, the handbook, the Copy Centre, funding for clubs and departmental student unions, the Ombuds Office, Nightline, events, Clubs Days, a bursary program, the Legal Aid Clinic, as well as providing employment for students.



Treasurer's report

Treasurer's Responsibilities

The Treasurer's responsibilities are to ensure that all Society funds are deposited in an appropriate account and to keep careful account and be responsible for all monies received and disbursed by or on behalf of the Society as per bylaw 4(5).

Food and Beverage Services (FBS)

These are the SFSS's commercial activities that include The Ladle, Higher Grounds coffee shop, and the Highland Pub. In the 2011-2012 year, FBS lost a total of \$309,279. This cannot be attributed to any one commercial service alone. It is difficult to separate how much time is spent by management and other employees on each service.

Space Expansion Fund (SEF)

AP-39-3: The Space Expansion Fund may only be spent on the renovation, operating expenditures, repair, maintenance and creation of student space on campus under the jurisdiction of the Simon Fraser Student Society.

The SEF may not be used to pay for operational costs of running the services of the student society. As of April 30, 2012, the fund balance is \$3,643,667.

Forum Stipends

This year, Forum stipends have been increased by \$11,000. This can be attributed to bi-weekly meetings as opposed to monthly meetings. The rationale behind bi-weekly meetings is engage Forum in critical board decisions such as MBC Food Court Renovations and Build SFU.

Board of Directors Non-Executive Stipends

This years, the board increased non-executive stipends line by \$31,900. Faculty Representatives are required to complete 60 hours of work a month as opposed to 40 hours a month previously. This change is to reflect the increased workload on non-executive board of directors.

SFSS USB Drive

This year, the board decided to distribute USB jump drives to the undergrad population as opposed to the SFSS handbook from previous years. We have been informed from our student population that the handbook is not as environmentally friendly or as versatile as something more electronic. Students prefer USB jump drives than the traditional handbook. The amount allocated to this item is \$25,000 for 10,000 USB Drives.

Bursaries

This year, SFSS contributed \$20,000 to bursaries for SFU students. Out of the \$20,000, the provincial government will match \$10,000. This is an increase of \$10,000 from previous years.

Departmental Student Unions (DSU)

For the current fiscal year, department 12 which exclusively service the broadest, most democratic SFSS groups, the departmental student unions saw an increase in their funding by 48.6% from \$60,454 in 2011/2012 to \$124,300 in 2012/2013. Out of current allocation, \$108,082 is targeted funding, secured through 2 successful referenda campaigns. The first referendum held in 2008 allowed for \$0.50 of funding



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per student to be targeted to DSUs. This meant that DSUs are guaranteed \$30,881 in funding prior to 2012. The second referendum held this year successfully secured \$1.25 per student, which translated to \$77,201 in guaranteed funding every year through reallocation of the Space Expansion Fund.

This meant that the DSUs are getting their full funding allocation as promised back in 2008 when SFSS defederated from the CFS. These funds are distributed back to 55 student unions and 2 constituency groups through their core and grant funding.

As of October 22, 2012, there are 46 out of 55 officially recognized student unions and 1 constituency group that are declared active. The budget breakdown and allocation are as follow

Clubs

This year, total funding for clubs is \$152,000, an increase of \$94,546 from previous year 2011/2012. We have a total of 239 clubs, 197 are currently active. Similar to DSUs, \$108,082 is targeted funding, secured through 2 successful referenda campaigns. The first referendum held in 2008 allowed for \$0.50 of funding per student to be targeted to clubs. This meant that clubs are guaranteed \$30,881 in funding prior to 2012. The second referendum held this year successfully secured \$1.25 per student, which translated to \$77,201 in guaranteed funding every year through reallocation of the Space Expansion Fund. Looking Forward

The SFSS Board of Directors is currently looking to increase funding and revenues in future years:

- 3 New Food Court Vendors: This will increase the operating fund by approximately \$45,000 annually
- · Improve FBS operations and financials
- · Improve communications with membership

SFSS Spaces

Atrium Renovations

Over the last six months, the SFSS has worked towards creating a food court in the Maggie Benston Centre Atrium! The expected time of completion is beginning of Spring 2012.

We have added:

- · Three new food vendors
- · Nine new microwaves
- New furniture
- · Brighter lighting

MBC Zero Level

More study spaces have been created on the zero-level of the Maggie Benston Centre. New furniture has been added along with easy accessibility to power-plugs.

Forum Chambers

The SFSS Board of Directors has submitted a request to begin renovating the Forum Chambers space. The initial step is a quote for a fresh coat of paint, fix the leaky ceilings and remove molding ceiling tiles, add a projector, and unbolt the fixed seating to increase the flexible usage of the space.

Images Theatre Entrance and Seating

SFU has committed funds to renovating the "bring your own laptop" space and entrance area of the Images Theater. This project should make the study spaces more comfortable and effective, with a variety of lounge style seating spaces.

Lobbying for More Student Space

Beginning last year, the SFSS took a role in lobbying the university to upgrade common spaces on campus. As the SFSS did our part with renovations, the University has completed a renovation of the fifth floor classrooms, AQ bathrooms, student spaces in the AQ, and the dining halls. They have also made a considerable effort to reupholster or replace worn furniture in existing student space. These renovations make the spaces more student-friendly, with power plugs and information group meeting space. The SFSS will continue to lobby the university and thanks them for the efforts they have made in this area.

Build SFU MoU:

SFU and the SFSS signed the MoU (memorandum of understanding) for the Build SFU Project on September 17th, 2012. This MoU will formally set all the discussions between the two groups on how this highly collaborative project will move forward. New website

In December 2011 the Board of Directors created a working group consisting of three Directors (Shiva Manavipour, Danielle Hornstein and Jenni Rempel) and the Communications Coordinator, Stijn Daenens. The working group decided quickly that the only way forward was to have a website developped on an open source platform and they picked Drupal. Drupal is very versatile and is used by an increasing number of companies, governments and non-profits around the globe. An RFP (request for proposal) was sent out to Vancouverbased developers in late December 2011. The working group decided to move forward with a company run by SFU alumni, Tidal Interactive. From then on, Shiva and Stijn worked with Tidal interactive on a daily base to complete the project.

On August 1st the revamped <u>sfss.ca</u> finally launched. It features a community events calendar (allowing anyone to submit events), extensive club and DSU support, timesensitive volunteer opportunities, committee structures, etc.



Ombudsperson Joint Funding Change

Bursaries

The SFSS has doubled its funding for Student bursaries from \$10,000 to \$20,000. This increase in funding is in accordance with our continued efforts towards aiding students in financial distress.

Build SFU Project Workers:

Build SFU, a project of the SFSS, has hired four new student employees. These students will help establish the brand, engage in consultations, and be a presence in the Think Tank. They will help reach out to the SFU community and document the feedback required for the success of the Build SFU project. We are excited about their new role within the SFSS.

Advocacy Committee

Advocacy Committee is an official member of both the "Where's the Funding?!" and "Get On Board" campaigns. Although it struggled to reach quorum over its Summer term, the committee has a promising Fall semester outlook.
