7. DISCUSSION ITEMS

7.1 Speaker Expenditure

- John Flipse and Curtis came up with an alternate method for all parties involved.
- John secured a subwoofer and two speakers for the Pub.
- Speakers will be of a similar size to the ones that are previously rented from Long & McQuade.
- Will come out of the Pub's expenditure; Events committee will be charged the same as Long & McQuade for renting.
- The understanding is that the speakers will only be used in the Pub.
- Will be an approximate \$100.00 charge for any SFSS member who wants to rent them out.

7.2 Halloween Pub Night

- Mudi and Curtis have been working on the logistics of this.
- Looked at secured production and planning on doing intelligent lighting.
- Ticket sales are almost at 200 right now; will be 300 presale tickets and about 40 at the door.

7.5 SFSS Holiday Event

- Project leads are Larissa and Raajan.
- Similar format to last year; Angel trees.
- Last year received about 86 baby blankets and miscellaneous baby supplies.
- Fundraising initiatives for the lower mainland; SFU currently hosts 20 sponsorship students.
- There will be a call out to inform students of donations.
- Messaging will be done through a marketing calendar and preplanned post.
 - o In collaboration with the SFSS communications department.
- International students connected Larissa with the following contacts:
 - o Middle Eastern Friendship Centre
 - o Pave the Road BC
 - SFU WUSC (World University Service of Canada)
- Donations will go towards student refugees and the Friendship Centre.
 - Gift cards given to the students and physical donations given to the Friendship Centre.
- It was noted that a grant total of donations received for each day will be needed.
- The committee expressed interest for Larissa to bring two separate proposals for the well-being and pancake breakfast portions of the Event.
- The committee discussed possibilities of changing the well-being portion of the Event proposal so the Advocacy committee may also get involved as some parts of it may fit that committee's portfolio.
- The committee discussed if this should be catered to refugee students specifically or international students with refugee students included.
 - Cause of concern may be that some students feel stigmatized by the title "refugee"; prefer the term "sponsorship" students.
 - o Might be beneficial to state that the event is an initiative to fund some refugee as well as international student concerns.
- The committee noted that the SFSS hasn't done anything in collaboration with or for WUSC.
- A committee member expressed interest in having more options to work with local charities.
 - o Curtis and Mudi will look into local charities that are for SFU students.
- Committee members will provide insights via an offline conversation with Larissa for next week's meeting



- Larissa will bring two separate proposals for next week's meeting as well as come with preliminary sponsorships.
- The Social can be in the Pub or in a space that doesn't require a booking cost.
- In the past, SFU Student Services covered half the grilling costs for the week of welcome which helped mitigate the costs to the Events committee.
- Last year was funded by Nesters, Graduate Student Society (GSS), Document Solutions, and the Advocacy Committee.
- It was noted that the total budget may be less than outlined in the attachment.
- A callout for volunteers will be done if needed; Last year 5 volunteers worked at the grill and 2 volunteers took photos of Santa.
- Suggestions from Hangue following his involvement with the pancake breakfast last year:
 - o Get all sponsorship secured.
 - o Reach out to Lawrence & Adrienne for help.
 - Get adequate cutlery and pancake supplies (increase the cost of pancake supplies).
 - o Reach out to music groups or have a Christmas playlist as background music.
- There were some concerns raised of having a third pancake breakfast this year, as well as the cost of the pancake breakfast which will take up a quarter of the budget if sponsorship is not received.

OVERVIEW

The 2016 SFSS Holiday Campaign is a fundraising initiative for refugees located in the Lower Mainland, with a particular focus on those within our membership. Furthermore, it aims to work alongside SFSS student groups to celebrate the holiday season and its festivities. The goal is to collect and donate 100 care boxes and/or gift cards. SFU currently sponsors refugee students, through the World University Service of Canada (WUSC) scholarship program. This project is currently being funded through efforts of SFU students and SFSS.

SFSS PILLAR OF VALUES

This project aligns with the social and financial aspect of the SFSS mandate. We hope to encourage social interactions amongst SFU students and members of the refugee population. Furthermore, we hope to collect donations through gift cards for our SFU refugee students.

- o Still in progress with stakeholders/recipients, will come in different proposal.
- Under the WUSC sponsorship program, SFU refugee students are fully sponsored by the SFSS for their first two
 years (living expenses, food & tuition). Currently, 5 students live on campus and the rest live off campus.
- During the holidays, these students are prone to experiencing isolation, loneliness and depression. Majority of these students are Muslim but still appreciates small tokens of appreciation. This can take form in the shape of a small dinner gathering event (SFSS + WUSC student dinner), or through small gifts collected from the SFU community.
- Another possibility can be an international student holiday gathering event.
