**6.1 CSSS SILICON VALLEY 2025**

**SUBMITTED BY: Computing Science Student Society**

**PRESENTED BY: Computing Science Director of Events**

**ATTACHMENTS: CSSS Silicon Valley 2024 Presentation**

- CSSS hosts an annual trip to Silicon Valley where students are given the opportunity to visit tech companies to network, meet alumni, and build connections.
  - The trip is not exclusive to CSSS students and is open to other DSU's as well.
- CSSS is seeking \$10,500 in grant funding to subsidize the costs of the trip for students attending.
- VP Finance confirmed that CSSS received \$7,500 in funding for the previous year's trip. She also mentioned that the Student Union grant budget is nearly capped out and that they are estimated to go over budget by the end of January.
  - VP Finance mentioned that CSSS has been recommended \$5,000 in funding from staff.
- Geography listed to question whether there is any way to lower expenses for the trip.
  - CSSS responded that they are using the same accommodations that were previously used, and that flight pricing tends to fluctuate.

- CSSS also mentioned that they are willing to pursue less costly options.
- Operations Manager clarified that CSSS can be given \$5,000 in grant funding from staff, but the additional \$2500 in funding for travel and conference would have to be appealed to council for approval.
- CSSS clarified that they were awarded \$7,500 in grant funding last year, however this was a significant reduction in what they had received the year before that where they received \$12,000.
  - VP Finance spoke about the many grants that have already been awarded to CSSS and that the SFSS is seeking to minimize spending so that they do not go over budget.
- President questioned if the event will be ticketed.
  - CSSS stated that the event will be at a cost for students but hope to receive funding to subsidize expenses.
- CSSS listed to state that \$5,000 is too little, and he agrees that \$10,000 might be a lot to ask for, so they are open to seeking another offer that is more equitable.
- VP Finance listed to clarify how much it would cost per student after receiving grant funding.
  - CSSS responded that the \$750 paid per student is assuming they receive funding.
  - VP Finance asked whether it would be possible to obtain funding through the department.
  - CSSS responded that a portion of the cover provided by CSSS is coming from the department.
- FNMISA listed to ask whether CSSS has considered sponsorships, and if the tech companies are willing to assist in any way.
  - CSSS responded that the tech companies do not typically assist students in hosting these events.
- English listed to mention that CSSS was previously awarded \$7,500 in funding but are requesting \$10,500 this year. Wondering why there is such a drastic jump in the requested amount.
  - CSSS responded that they had been given more funding through the faculty which means they were able to receive less in grant funding.
- Philosophy listed to question how much funding is being allocated for the trip from CSSS themselves.
  - CSSS responded that the cost breakdown provided in the presentation shows how much CSSS is covering.
- Geography listed to question why the event must take place in Silicon Valley and whether it can be hosted in a geographically closer location, such as Seattle.
  - CSSS stated that Silicon Valley is the heart of tech innovation and that there is a great number of SFU alumni located in Silicon Valley. So, there is a better opportunity for students to connect with others.

## 7. OLD BUSINESS

### 7.1 CSSS Silicon Valley 2025 – MOTION COUNCIL 2024-12-18:03

**Submitted by: Computing Science Student Society**

**CSA / VP Finance**

Whereas the Computing Science Student Society is planning to organize a trip to Silicon Valley

from April 29th to May 3rd, 2025;

Whereas the Computing Science Student Society has successfully ran the trip to Silicon Valley four times since 2017, touring companies including Apple, Google, Meta, and more;

Whereas the students are able to network and learn about careers at these companies;

Whereas they are seeking financial support above what admin and staff are allowed to approve;

Whereas they are requesting \$10,500 of funding to support the students for this event;

Be it resolved to approve spending up to \$5,000 (\$2,500 from 5000G, \$2,500 from 5016T) for the trip.

**CARRIED AS AMENDED**

**Abstain: VP Events**

**Dissent: Philosophy**

- VP Events listed to state that they have a conflict of interest, and will therefore be abstaining.
- Philosophy listed to mention that they would not be willing to approve more than \$3000 in funding to be allocated towards this event.
- CSSS listed to ask what is the remaining amount of funding left in the Student Union grant budget.
  - VP Finance responded that she does not have the exact total at the moment and referred to Operations Manager for this.
  - Operations Manager responded that she does not have the exact total either but based on calculations, it is estimated that the budget will be depleted by the end of January.
- MBBSU listed to mention that it would be better to seek a more local alternative for the event and seconds Philosophy's statement that \$3000 should be the maximum amount approved for the motion.
  - CSSS stated that this is the last major event hosted by CSSS and that \$3,000 is severely low to host the event.
  - CSSS also mentioned that they are seeking local collaborations for other events, however students derive inspiration and a sense of satisfaction from attending this event when it is hosted in Silicon Valley.
  - MBBSU responded to this to clarify that the SFSS cannot fully cover the expenses of the event.
  - CSSS clarified that the asking amount is not meant to cover the entire expenses since they have already raised funds through other events. The asking amount is only to help students in subsidizing some of the costs.
- Geography listed to request a breakdown of the costs.
  - CSSS provided the calculations.
- CSSS stated that they would be willing to accept \$7500 instead of the full \$10,500 That was originally requested.
- CSSS listed to clarify whether the travel conference funding is included in the motion.
  - VP Finance responded that the breakdown would have to be included in the motion.
- VP Finance listed to agree that \$3000 might be too little funding, but \$7500 is too much to

approve. So, \$5,000 would be the ideal amount for approval.

- CSSS is willing to accept this.
- Philosophy listed to voice their dissent.

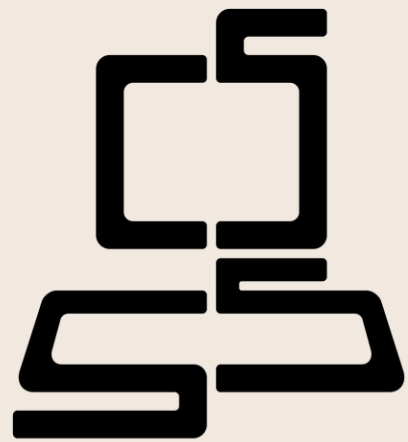

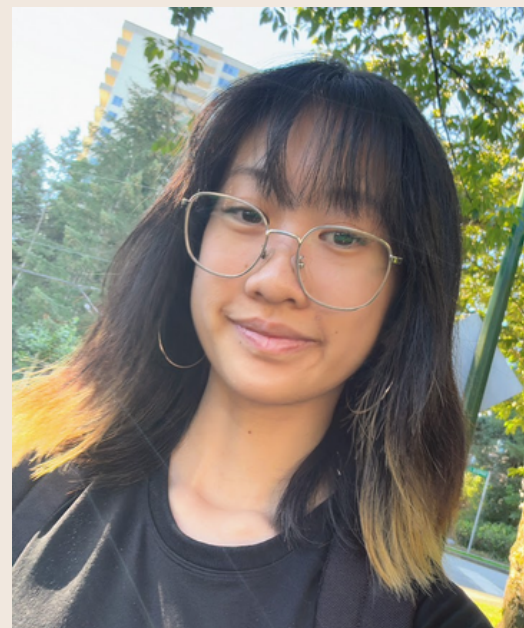
