5. PRESENTATION

5.1 SUS YEAR END FORMAL

SUBMITTED BY: Science Undergraduate Society PRESENTED BY: Science Undergraduate Society

- Science Councillor shared that the SUS Year-End Formal is an annual event for the past three (3) years to celebrate achievements, provide networking opportunities, and foster community.
 - Capacity of 160 attendees.
 - Budget of over \$18,000.00, where they were able to cover nearly half. SUS has been approved for a grant of \$2,850.00 and is asking for an additional \$6.684.00 more to a total of \$9,534.00.
 - They have reduced their grant request from last year by nearly 30% with the changes to the current event, like venue and ticket price.
- VP Finance highlighted that SUS has decreased their grant request significantly since last year.
 - VP Finance also added that another group who hosted a smaller-scale event and were approved around \$7,000.00.
- Geography Councilor asked three questions: how much SUS got from the grant, why SUS is covering costs for drinks, when the attendees can do that on their own, and why is their trust account not used.
 - VP Finance answered the first question that the \$2,850.00 is the maximum amount staff can approve within their jurisdiction.
 - Science Councillor said that the drink are covered directly by the ticket revenue and the contingency fund is coming from SUS's core fund.
- President said that the SFSS does not consider contingency funds when approving grants. President asked VP Finance for further information and guidance on the matter.
 - VP Finance spoke that the Business Administration Student Society (BASS) accounts for contingency for their funding. This is a risk deposit that will come back but will be used if something comes up.
 - VP Finance said that this is not part of the SFSS funding guidelines, so it might be part of why the grant is lower.
- VP Finance asked how the contingency fund will be used.
 - Science Councillor said that SUS has never had to use the contingency fund so far, but if it were to be used it would be for medical emergencies, unexpected costs, or help someone get home if they cannot do so themselves.

- VP Internal said that some past grants with contingencies were approved. The current established SFSS policy states that contingencies are not counted towards grants. In aim to be fair for all groups, the SFSS should not include the contingency.
 - President suggested to decrease the total funding amount requested to \$8,400.00 by removing the continency fund.

 - Science Councillor said that the ticket fee increased from \$35.00 to \$45.00 this year.
 - Science Councillor shared that she will be transparent that she is not entirely sure why they do not do both at the same time. SUS does collect a drink cost, where they have historically provided two drinks per ticket. Every drink afterwards is paid by the attendee.
 - Science Councillor said that this could be connected to allocating the money back to covering the grant.
 - Part of the fee for the drinks also covers the bartender's wages.
 - VP Internal commented that the past formals for other groups, the drinks are included in the ticket price. If a drink ticket price is included, the price range will be around \$75.00 per attendee, which makes the event cost high considering the grants that have been sent out.
