6. REPORTS FROM EXECUTIVES

- **6.1** President has been meeting with staff, councillors, SFU staff, and learning about the initiatives of the VPs. He met with government officials at SFU residence to discuss the residence and childcare expansion.
- **6.2** VP Equity is getting familiar with the by-laws, collective agreement, and policies. He is looking to move the Council development session right before Council meetings. These development sessions will provide outreach skills for councillors so they can better connect with their student unions. VP Equity and the Biology Councillor are working on a recycling campaign that the previous VP Equity started. He is also working on an event for the summer term where students can learn more about green companies and NGOs. Additionally, he is attending outreach events and working on the food security programs. There will be a fundraiser to hopefully expand the breakfast program.
- **6.3** VP Events is currently looking at the events for the year. He wants to encourage student-led events this year while also bringing back popular and financially responsible events. One of his goals is to create a club audit system that will help categorize clubs. This will help the SFSS understand what kind of financial or resource support they might need. A mandatory training for club executives will be included in this system. VP Events will also work on a sponsorship package to help both the Society and student clubs to find sponsors. In terms of events, he plans to work more frequently with the AMS to connect the student of UBC and SFU. There are discussions about an inter-school sports competition. The executive team is also discussing a welcome event with a vendor-based approach like the Surrey Fusion Festival or Richmond Night Market. Pet therapy, LinkedIn photoshoots, and Clubs Day events will be continuing. VP Events will also focus on increasing social media outreach and presence. The next event is Clubs Night at The Pit with AMS on May 30th.
- **6.4** VP External has been attending meetings with potential partners and organizations. She is also meeting with AMS to discuss advocacy and campaign collaborations. VP External and the President had a meeting with the founder of Student House an organization focused on providing housing for students. She is currently working on an Open Education Resources campaign with SFU library. VP External is also preparing a presentation with the PRCA and Campaigns Coordinators for the BC budget consultation on June 5th. Overall, she is planning

out her advocacy plans for the council term and establishing priorities. She will be continuing an initiative started by the previous VP External with MOSAIC. MOSAIC is offering students and alumni a discount on the IELTS exam. It is still in the works but the discount will likely be based on the number of referrals they receive per period. VP External and the President will be attending a BCFS conference over the weekend and participate in workshops on lobbying, media relations, conflict resolution, etc.

6.5 VP University has been taking on a leadership role as the senior executive and working on internal/HR related matters. Continuing on projects from last year, he has been working on career opportunities with the firehall, student care, MOSAIC partnership, international student outreach. He is also setting up meetings with campus services, student services and other SFU departments and introducing them to the new executives. One of his biggest initiatives this year will be the push for hybrid classes.

 - Operations lead apologized for the delay and will check with the relevant staff.

- 9.2 Councillors asked about the future meeting time and location.
 - VP Equity stated they are looking to equip a bigger room with the right technology to host Council meetings. Currently only the 2000 level rooms have a TV, room microphone, and camera. He also shared that he is trying to organize the development sessions to happen right before Council meetings. This would mean that development sessions start at 4:30pm and Council meeting start at 5:30pm. The meeting start time will depend on the schedules of councillors.
